Step 1 7 Days Before

- Finish packing everything but the essentials.** Only daily-use things should still be out.
- File any last address changes.** Bank, subscriptions, the DMV — anything you put off.
- Truck move? Request your parking permit now.** City permits and "No Parking" signs take a few days. You will post them the day before.
- Container move? Confirm your drop date and clear the spot.** Hold the drop spot with a parked car until the container arrives.

Step 2 4-3 Days Before

- Take apart the big furniture.** Beds and tables travel safer broken down. Bag the screws and tape them to the piece.
- Use up or give away the food.** Eat down the fridge and freezer; donate unopened cans. No perishable food on the truck.
- Get rid of what can't ride along.** Flammables, spray cans, propane, paint, and most chemicals are not allowed.
- Start a "stays with me" pile.** Set aside papers, valuables, and medications you will carry yourself.

Step 3 2 Days Before

- Pack an essentials bag for each person.** A few days of clothes, toiletries, medications, chargers, and papers.
- Defrost and dry the fridge and freezer.** Empty it, unplug it, leave the doors open so it dries out.
- Touch base on the arrival window.** Confirm when they will arrive, the address and access, and that you are ready to pay.
- Charge everything and get some cash.** Phones, power banks, and small bills for tipping the crew.

Step 4 The Day Before

- Truck move? Post your parking signs.** Put them up tonight so the truck can get close in the morning.
- Set aside what stays with you.** Essentials bags, valuables, documents, keys, and an "open first" box — in your own car.
- Take a few photos.** Snap how electronics are wired and furniture before it comes apart.
- Do a last walk-through, then rest.** Closets, cabinets, the dishwasher, behind doors. Set your alarm — moving day starts early.

Save the spot for the truck or container. The closer it parks to your door, the cheaper the move — a long carry is one of the priciest add-ons. The two moves are not the same job:

- **Container:** it is dropped a few days ahead and sits while you load. Clear the spot and hold it with a parked car until it arrives — most cities do not regulate containers.
- **Truck:** it comes on move day. Ask the city early for a parking permit or "No Parking" signs (they take a few days), then post them the day before. Matters most in apartments and tight city streets.
